

Privacy Policy. Cookie Policy

The Prawo dla Nas Foundation places particular importance on protecting the personal data of visitors to the foundation's website (www.prawodlanas.pl) and social media profiles, including LinkedIn, Facebook, and Instagram, as well as those of applicants and its employees, collaborators, contractors, and clients. Therefore, all correspondence sent to us, whether by post, email, the above-mentioned social media channels, or by telephone, is subject to this Privacy Policy. Cookie Policy. The purpose of this Privacy Policy is to explain the principles of personal data processing and to discuss your fundamental rights related to our processing of your personal data.

Personal Data Controller

Pursuant to Article 13 paragraphs 1-2 of Regulation (EU) 2016/679 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 27 April 2016 on the protection of natural persons with regard to the processing of personal data and on the free movement of such data, and repealing Directive 95/46/EC (General Data Protection Regulation, "GDPR") (OJ EU L 119, p. 1), we hereby inform you that the Controller of your personal data is the "Prawo dla Nas" Foundation with its registered office in Kraków (30-062), Aleja 3 Maja 55, KRS 0000973374, NIP 6772478348, REGON 522135865.

1. What data do we process, for what purpose, and on what basis?

a. We process your personal data that you provide to us:

- by contacting us via the contact form (required data: email, name, and other data you provide)
- by contacting us via social media (your social media profile details and other data you provide)
- by contacting us for the first time via email (processed data: your email address, name, and other data you provide)
- by contacting us in connection with an ongoing relationship with us or in connection with the provision of legal assistance (name, name, and other data you provide)

b. We process the personal data we receive from you for the following purposes:

- contacting you (e.g., sending you a webinar link, confirming your registration for a training course, etc.)

- responding to your inquiry,
- providing legal assistance
- cooperating
- activities aimed at managing our website and ensuring effective communication

c. The legal basis for such processing is:

- Article 6(1)(a) of the GDPR, which allows us to process data based on consent for the purpose of responding to your message or inquiry
- Article 6(1)(f) of the GDPR, which allows us to pursue our legitimate interest in ensuring efficient and effective communication between the website administrator and the user, managing the website, including cookies to the extent necessary
- Article 6(1)(b) of the GDPR for the performance of and on the basis of a contract, if we have entered into one
- Article 6(1)(f) of the GDPR for archival (evidential) purposes, which are the pursuit of our legitimate interest in securing information in the event of a legal need to prove facts;
- Art. 6, paragraph 1, letter f GDPR, for the purpose of establishing, pursuing, or defending against legal claims, which is the pursuit of our legitimate interest in this respect.

2. Voluntary provision of personal data.

Providing personal data is voluntary, but in some cases it is necessary to establish and settle cooperation or respond to an inquiry.

3. Possibility of withdrawing consent.

You may withdraw your consent to the processing of personal data at any time. Withdrawal of consent to data processing does not affect the lawfulness of data processing carried out by the Controller based on consent before its withdrawal. You can withdraw your consent by sending an email to biuro@prawodlanas.pl.

4. Recipients of data.

Recipients of personal data may include: employees and collaborators of the Controller as part of projects conducted in accordance with its statutory objectives, ICT service providers, courier companies, Poczta Polska, legal service providers, and advertising service providers.

5. Transfer of Personal Data to a Third Country:

We do not transfer your data outside the European Economic Area (comprising the European Union, Norway, Liechtenstein, and Iceland), with the exception of possible transfers to the United States of America (USA) in connection with their storage on US servers, in whole or in part. Currently, the services offered by Google LLC and Meta Platforms (Facebook, Instagram) are primarily provided by entities located in the European Union. However, the User should always review the privacy policies of these providers to obtain up-to-date information regarding the protection of their personal data. However, if User data may be transferred outside the European Union to third countries, it will be transferred only to recipients who guarantee the highest level of data protection and security, including through: cooperation with entities processing personal data in countries for which a relevant decision has been issued by the European Commission, the use of standard contractual clauses issued by the European Commission, the use of binding corporate rules approved by the relevant supervisory authority, or to those for which the User has consented. Google and Meta Platforms (Facebook) use compliance mechanisms provided by the GDPR or standard contractual clauses. Detailed information is available in the privacy policies of each service provider, available on their websites.

6. Rights of Data Subjects:

The data subject has the right to access, rectify, erase (the right to be forgotten), restrict processing, the right to data portability, and the right to withdraw consent to processing at any time, without affecting the lawfulness of processing based on consent before its withdrawal.

7. Right to Object:

The data subject has the right to object to the processing of their data by the Controller. The objection should be submitted to the following email address: biuro@prawodlanas.pl or to the following address: Aleja 3 Maja 55, 30-062 Kraków.

8. Right to File a Complaint with the Personal Data Protection Office (PUODO).

If the data subject believes that the Controller's processing of their personal data violates the provisions of the Personal Data Protection Regulation, they have the right to lodge a complaint with the President of the Personal Data Protection Office (UODO).

9. Retention of your personal data:

We delete your personal data if it is no longer necessary to achieve the purposes for which it was collected, i.e., for the duration of the service provision or if you have effectively objected to the processing of your

personal data. However, statutory requirements may require us to retain your personal data for a longer period, i.e.:

- in connection with the performance of a contract – for the duration of the contract, and after its termination until the legal obligation expires;
- in connection with the pursuit and defense of potential claims – until the statute of limitations for claims;
- in connection with the fulfillment of legal obligations – until the legal obligation expires.

10. Cookie Policy

We use cookies and other similar mechanisms to better understand how users use our website. Cookies are small text files stored on your device (computer, phone, etc.) and contain information about your use of our website. Some cookies are necessary for the website to function properly. For other cookies, we ask for your consent to their installation during your first visit. You can change your cookie settings at any time using the options available here or in your browser settings. Blocking previously accepted cookies will be treated as a revocation of consent and will result in us no longer processing them. Below, we describe which cookies we use and which companies may receive your data.

Cookie Consent

When you first visit our website, you must accept cookies or take other possible actions indicated in the notification to continue using the website's content. By using the website, you consent to them. If you do not wish to accept cookies, please leave the website. You can also change your browser settings at any time, disable or delete cookies.

What cookies do we use?

Only necessary Cookies

- They ensure the proper functioning of the website. They cannot be disabled, as the website will not function properly without them.
- We use Cookiebot to store your privacy settings, which indicate whether or not you consent to the use of specific types of cookies.
- Other essential cookies are used to manage the website, make changes, run tracking tools (e.g., Google Tag Manager), and ensure the security of the website.

Statistical Analysis of Our Website

We use tools to collect statistical data that help us understand how users use our website. This data does not identify a specific person, and we do not combine it with other data about you. We use Google Analytics, which collects information such as the number of visits, subpages visited, dates of the first and last visit, length of visit, visit source, browser used, links clicked, and geographic location. Our version of Google Analytics does not collect user IP addresses. Google Analytics assigns users a unique identifier (Google ID), and cookie data is stored on their servers. We only receive reports on website traffic, and this data only includes users who have consented to the use of Google Analytics. We use IP address shortening technology to anonymize your IP address before transmitting it to Google. You can prevent Google Analytics from collecting this information by installing a special plug-in.

Links to our social media profiles, social plugins. Our website also includes links to our social media profiles, such as Facebook, Instagram, and LinkedIn. Information about how a given website processes your personal data can be found in the privacy policy of that website.

If you use such a plugin, the owner of the social media site receives information that your browser has viewed our Website, even if you are not logged in to that social media site or do not have a profile on it.

If you logged in to one of the aforementioned social media sites before visiting our Website, the owner will be able to directly associate your visit to our Website with your profile on that site.

Further details on the use of information from social plugins can be found on the websites of the providers of those sites.

If you do not want social media sites to associate data collected during your visit to the Website directly with your profile on that site, you must log out of that site before visiting our Website.

11. Changes to the Privacy Policy

We reserve the right to make changes—at our sole discretion and as needed—to our privacy practices and to amend this Privacy Policy at any time. Therefore, we encourage you to regularly review the provisions of this Privacy Policy. This Privacy Policy is current as of the "last modified" date indicated above.
